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Psychoactive susbstances (mainly alcohol) and road unsafety in the EU

In the EU nearly 25% of road crashes would be due to drinkdriving and/or drugged-driving (about 7,500 persons killed per year).

In most of those accidents drink-driving is the issue, even if other substances like medicines and drugs constitute a growing problem.

What is the French situation?

Drink-driving countermeasures

- Well known
- Mandatory alcohol testing for drivers involved in road crashes, especially in case of death or severe injury
- Random road side checks: 11 millions last year in France(130,000 above the BAC limit)
- Targeted checks: close to the discos, etc...
- Mandatory presence of alcohol testing devices in discos or other places (closing between 2 and 7 am) in France of 1st of December 2011

Alcohol interlock (1)

- In the meeting of the Interministerial Commission for Road Safety in February 2008, the decision was taken to fit school buses with alcohol interlocks
- An experiment has been carried out at the end of 2009 in order to consider all the issues:
 - 6 companies (300 vehicles were equipped)
 - 3 different devices from 3 different providers (companies were free to choose the provider)



Alcohol interlock (2)

 New buses and coaches used for school transport and allowed in traffic as of the 1st of January 2010 must be fitted with alcohol interlocks

- As of the 1st of September 2015 all buses or coaches used for school transport will have to be equipped with an alcohol interlock (retrofitting)



Alcohol interlock: perspectives

- A law has been adopted in March 2011 aiming at better tackling drink-driving
- in case a driver is caught with a BAC of more than 0,8 g/l the judge can impose the following sentence as a complementary penalty: driving only allowed if the vehicle is fitted with an alcohol interlock
- duration between 6 months and 5 years. If the driver doesn't respect this obligation → fine up to 4,500 € and imprisonment up to 2 years



Alcohol interlock: questions to be shared

- In countries which have already or will soon implemented such a measure:
 - Are re-tests mandatory? What happens in case the driver refuses to perform them?
 - Do these countries organise a monitoring? If yes what kind of monitoring?
 - Which body or organisation does analyse the data downloaded and with which aim?
 Rehabilitation?
