
Driver Rehabilitation programmes

- Systematic measures for traffic offenders
- Aiming at a change of their behaviour in order to prevent further offences



Development of Driver Rehabilitation in Austria







Types of programmes

Severe Offences

- 4 sessions
- 12 units + test drive

Alcohol Offences

- 4 sessions
- 15 units

Drug Offences

- 4 sessions
- 15 units

Demerit Point System

- 4 sessions
- 15 units








- 6 to 11 participants
- Within 22 to 40 days
- Only 1 session per day (3-5 units)
- At least 2 days within each session



Frame Conditions

- Trainers are specially trained psychologists
- Fixed prices
- Dismissal from courses
 - lack of participation
 - intoxication (0,1 %)
 - severe behavioural problems



Aims

- Analysing causes of undesirable behaviour
- Influencing individual attitudes and behaviour
- Initiating realistic self-perception and self-reflection

Developing desired and adapted safety-oriented

alternatives





Effectiveness

- DR interventions are highly accepted and positively evaluated by DUI and DUID offenders (evaluation: 95% good or very good)
- Participants are supported for their cognitive and behavioural change processes
- Participants feel encouraged to establish new behavioural goals
- Important role of the course leader



Demerit Point System Austria

- Includes 13 offences
 - 1 offence: penalty point
 - 2 offences at the same time: immediate measure
 - 2 offences within 2 years: immediate measure
 - 3 offences within 2 years: withdrawl of licence
- Measures include:
 - Driver Rehabilitation, Psychology Session, Driving Lesson

Best Practice Handbook for the implementation of an effective DPS





The Handbook: Aims, Scope and Target Audience

- Recommended practices for designing and implementing a DPS
 - Offences & points, user groups, thresholds
 - Intermediate measures
 - · Rehabilitation measures
 - Administrative and organisational issues
- Targeted at
 - Member States' authorities: setting up, modifying, reviewing their DPS
 - EU institutions



Intermediate & Rehabilitation Measures

Four-step approach:

- 1. Information and warning letters
- 2. Driver improvement course on attitudes & behaviour rather than knowledge & skills.
- 3. Licence **withdrawal** for a period of between 3 and 12 months.
- **4. Rehabilitation** course. For severe cases include medical-psychological examination and behavioural assistance & monitoring.







Recommended points catalogue

Only offences with straightforward relationship with crashes or crash severity:

- 1. **Speeding** (exceeding the legal speed limit)
- 2. **Alcohol** and/or **drugs**
- 3. **Seatbelt** wearing, **helmet** wearing (powered two-wheelers), **child restraints**
- 4. **Red light** running
- 5. Violation of **priority** rules
- 6. Dangerous overtaking
- 7. Minimum **headway** between vehicles
- 8. Endangering pedestrians at **zebra crossings**
- 9. Illegal use of **mobile phones** or other communication devices
- 10. Railway level crossings
- 11. Wrong way driving and use of forbidden lanes
- 12. **Hit and run** and other dangerous post-accident misbehaviour
