Girls take Action



- Target group
 - Girls aged 16–19 as members of the campaign
 - Their networks of both boys and girls
- The Norwegian Council for Road Safety wants to
 - Reduce the number of young people injured and killed on the
 - Help to increase girls' knowledge, skills and willingness to influence their traffic environment, both as passengers and as car drivers
 - Give girls the competence and self-confidence needed to act as a brake for their friends
- Girls take Action is a three-year campaign

Net community

- Origo, similar to Facebook
- Closed, exclusive, and no advertisements
- Photos/discussions/pages in memory of those killed in road accidents/themes/tips/facts

- To provide information








Why girls?





- A high proportion of accidents among young people
- Boys drive, girls are passengers
- Girls have great influence
- Different knowledge and interest in cars: a campaign adapted to girls







Girls throughout Norway are involved:





- Pilot project in mid-Norway (May 2007), 600 girls took part
- Nationwide from 2007, with some regional differences
- In 2010: a total of approx.
 9,000 girls registered in Girls take Action
- The girls receive an invitation by post the year they are to start at upper secondary school







Each letter contains a specific topic



- And in each letter they are urged to <u>do</u> something. What they do must be documented via the net forum and must be shared with the other girls:
 - Respond to a questionnaire together with a boy
 - Start a discussion in their family/circle of friends on a particular subject
 - Find out about and influence the attitudes within their circle of friends
 - Share thoughts, tips and advice with the other girls on the net
- Prizes drawn for their activity







The campaign increases activity and enhances knowledge





The girls want to be ambassadors for the message "Act as a brake for a friend"


Jeg må bare ta opp en ting som ikke har direkte med trafikk å gjare, men med dette fantastiske tiltaket



 And I'm very worried about him.
