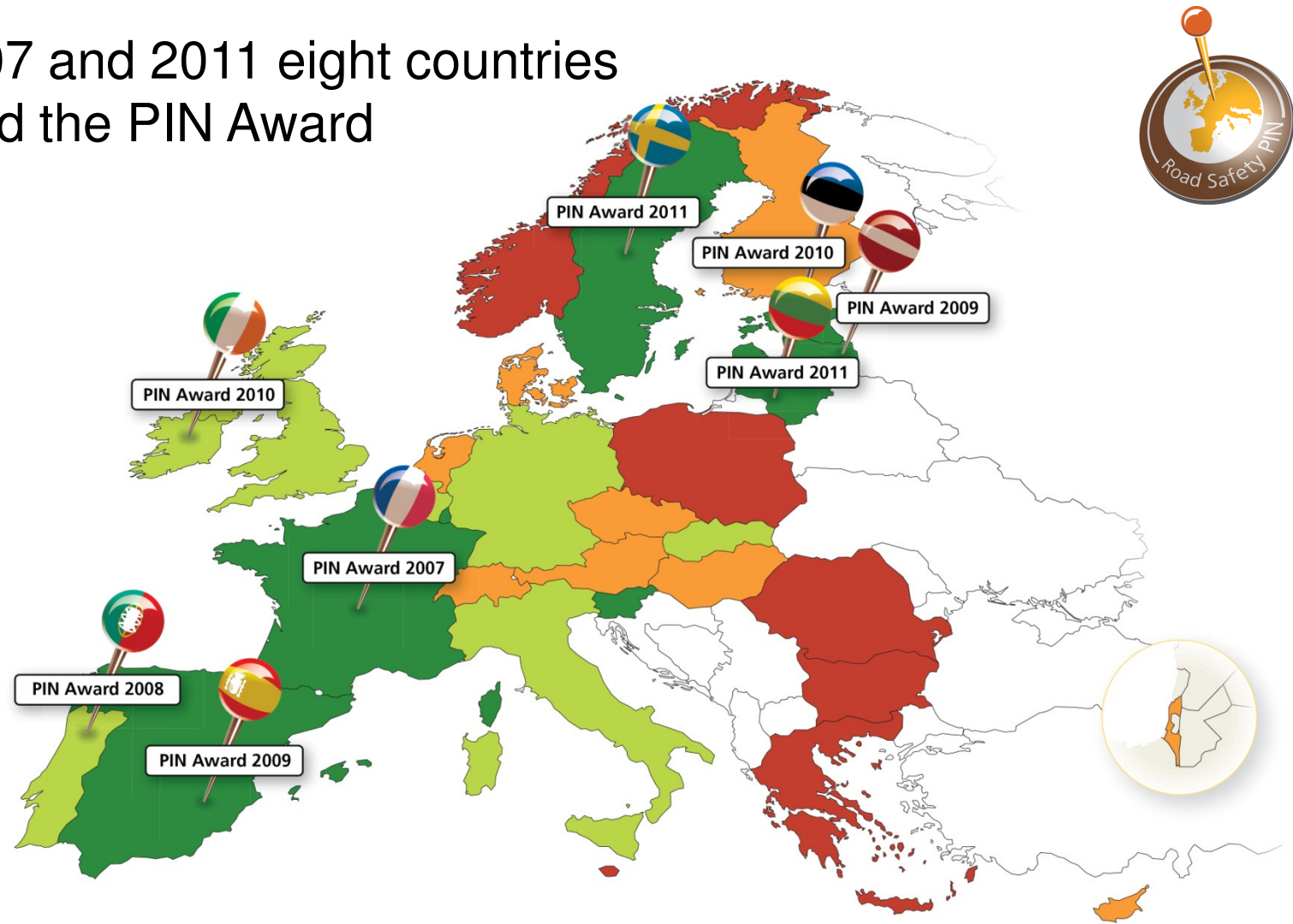


ETSC PIN Programme

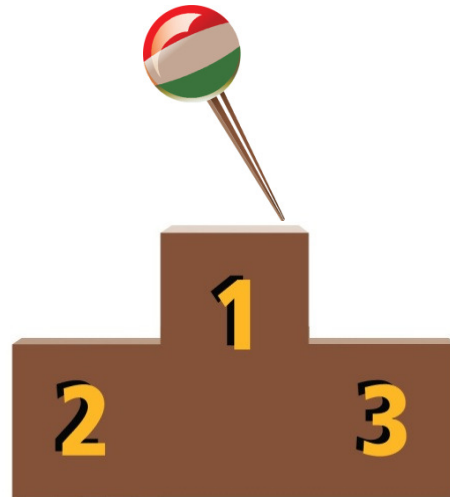
- Launched in June 2006 to **compare country performance** in road safety
- Currently includes the **27 EU Member States**, as well as Israel, Norway, Serbia and Switzerland
- A **PIN Panel**: experts from each of the 31 countries
- A **PIN Steering Group** with members from
 - SWOV, VTI, UCL and DaCoTA
 - European Commission
 - PIN sponsors
- **PIN receives support** from **Volvo Trucks and Volvo Group, Swedish Transport Administration, Norwegian Public Roads Administration, Toyota Motor Europe**

Between 2007 and 2011 eight countries have received the PIN Award



Road Safety PIN Award 2012



- ✓ Substantial reduction in road deaths since 2001
- ✓ Implementation of comprehensive road safety policies and measures
- ✓ Increased enforcement of major traffic offences

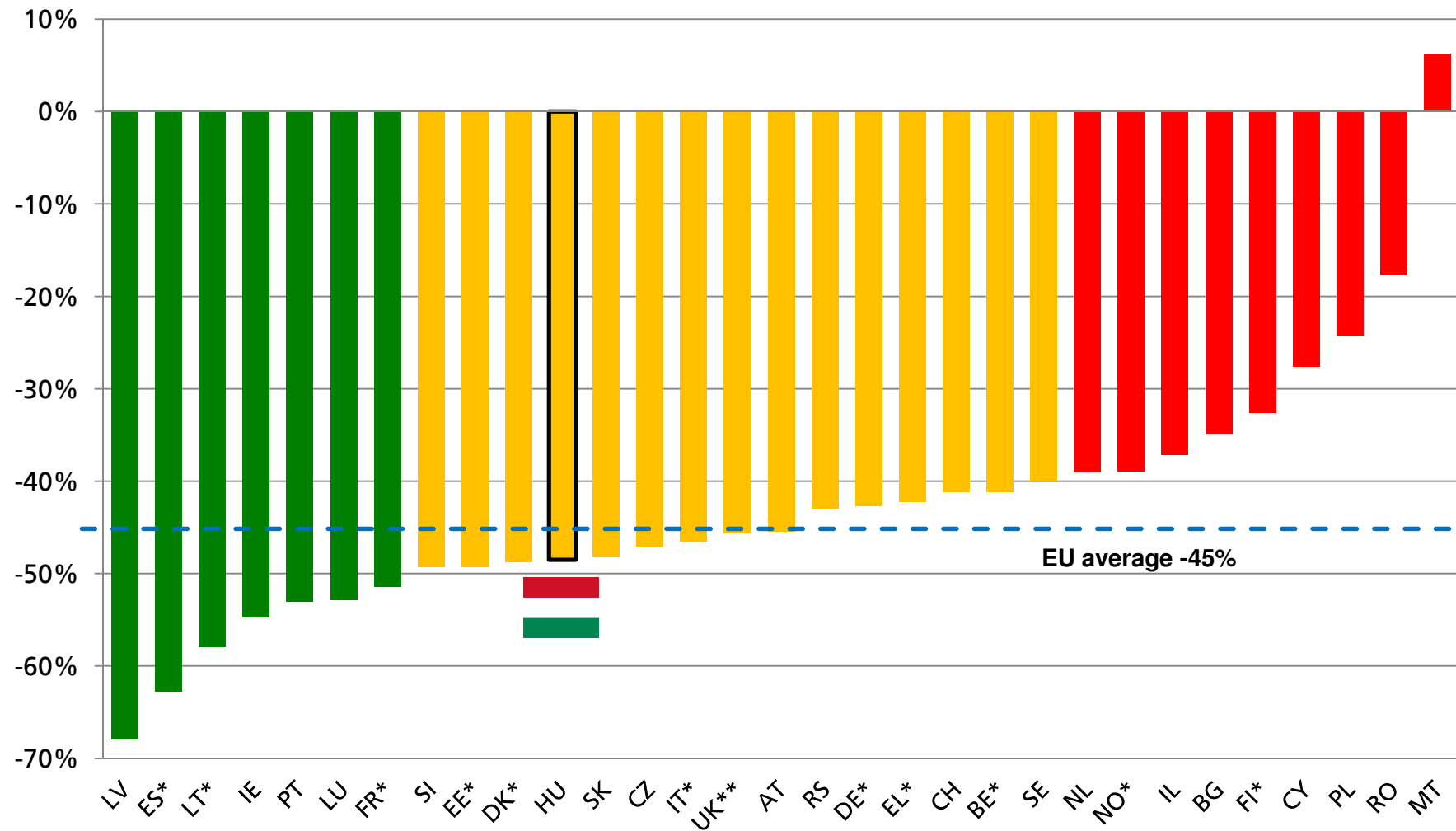
PIN Award 2012 to Hungary

- ✓ 14% reduction in road deaths 2010- 2011
- ✓ 49% reduction in road deaths 2001- 2011
- ✓ Road deaths per million population cut by more than half between 2001 and 2011
- ✓ 3rd country (behind Malta and Slovakia) for road deaths per million inhabitants among the countries that joined in 2004.

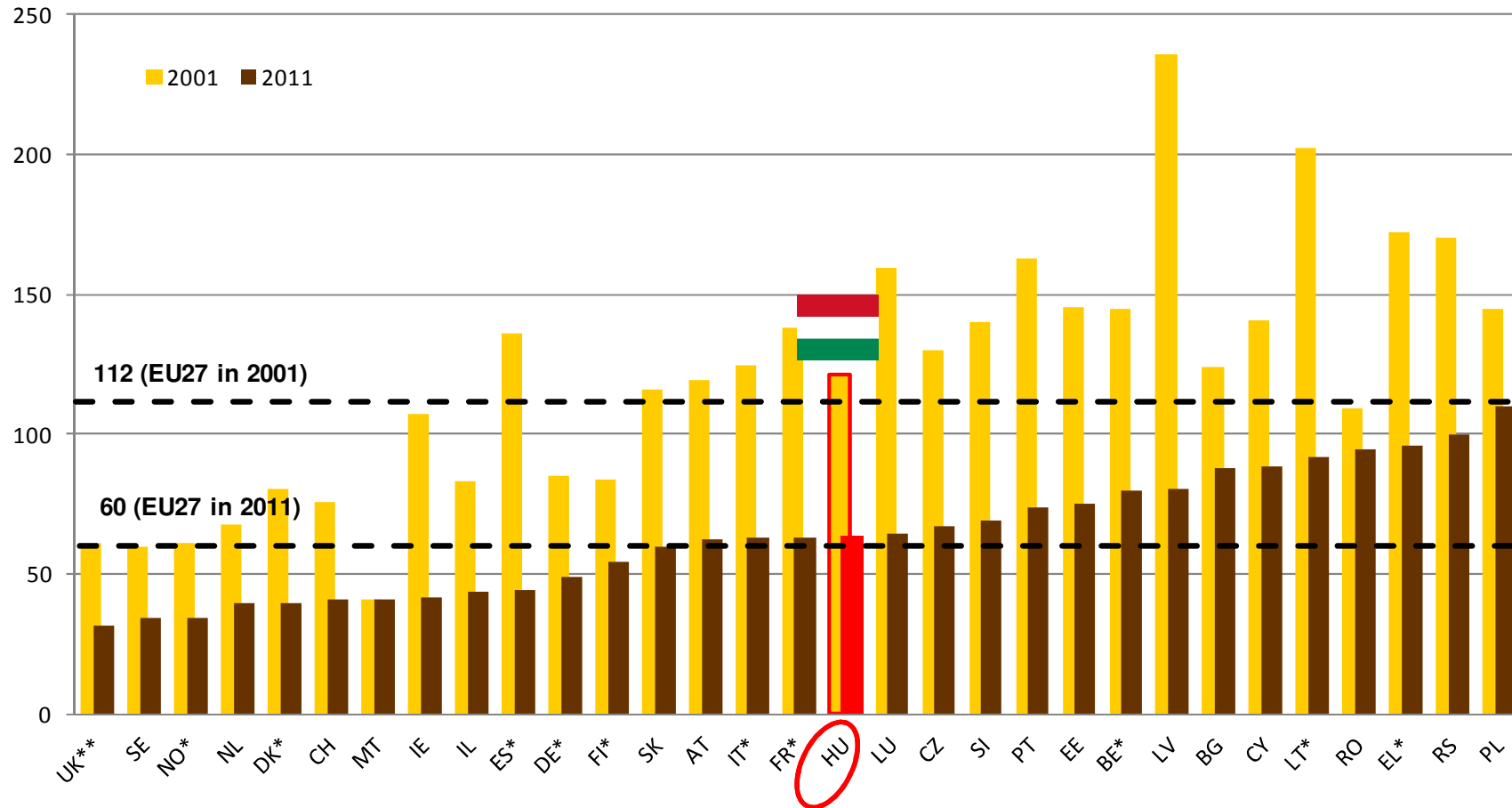


Progress since 2001

PIN Award 2012 to Hungary

✓ Progress helped by a comprehensive set of road safety measures:

- Introduction of owner liability
- Introduction of speed camera enforcement
- Zero tolerance for drink driving
- Introduction of a penalty point system
- Infrastructure improvement schemes
- Education and awareness campaigns
- Road safety management: inter-ministerial coordination of road safety policy



No room for complacency

- Still more than **600** people die on Hungarian roads each year
- **64** road deaths per million population
 - 14th out of 27 in road mortality



- Increase compliance with traffic laws
- Improve the safety of unprotected road users
- Improve the safety of the infrastructure
- Take full advantage of speed enforcement technologies
